GO DOWN IN HISTORY

Looking for a venue with a back story? With its quirky period décor and terracotta-coloured walls, Pauntley Court in Gloucestershire is now available to couples as an exclusive-use wedding space. The building is even said to be the birthplace of the great Dick Whittington, who fled to London from here during the 1300s. Tie the knot in the Norman church next door, before heading back to the manor for a grand soiree in the ballroom for 50 people, or the flat terrace for up to 150 guests. pauntleycourt.com
